The Lord gave us promises – quite clear promises from Scripture. We could not deny that he was saying we would become established, we would grow. But it still didn't happen! For years the heavenly Father said "wait".

Although we were unaware of it he was teaching us important lessons in those years when he said, "wait". A work of God needs secure foundations and that doesn't happen overnight. Trust in God has to be deeper than the thrill of immediately answered prayer or it will not stand in the storms of life. It was a lesson in patience and humility.

Perhaps the answer to some of your prayers is "wait". Be encouraged the answer will come but don't miss the lessons that the heavenly Father is teaching you on this way.
